At age 12 she received a scholarship to attend the Royal School of Church Music summer camp in North Carolina. This camp was a life changing experience and sparked her passion for singing. She worked with the renowned director Simon Lole and learned incredible new and advanced music. She went back for a second and third time. As a freshman in high school, Emma joined the Sprague Women's Choir, and at the start of her second semester, she joined Sprague's Ensemble Choir. Additionally, she auditioned for and was accepted into Salem's All City Honor Choir, which she also participated in as a sophomore and junior. As a sophomore, she started voice lessons, and began singing in Sprague's Concert Choir. Sprague won 4th place at the State competition that year and during spring break, toured in Canada for a week. That summer, she was selected to join the Oregon Ambassadors of Music honor choir. The OAM honor choir toured in Europe for 2 weeks, singing in a total of 7 different countries. In her Junior year, she participated in the Willamette Master Chorus honor choir and sang John Rutter's Requiem Mass, and "Who Lives, Who Dies, Who Tells Your Story," from the Broadway Musical, Hamilton. She got to sing with them again when Sprague joined the Willamette Master Chorus for a winter concert. She also sang in St. Paul's "Play of Daniel" with the Grace Notes Choir and the Boston Camerata, with a solo as "the angel". Unfortunately, due to Covid-19, Emma was not able to do as many music related events in her senior year, though she still participated in Sprague's Concert Choir, and Sprague's jazz ensemble, Framework. Emma plans to continue singing in college and is currently deciding between DePaul University in Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, and St. Olaf College in Minnesota. She plans to study Film and aspires to be a Filmmaker someday.
