Jeannine is a champion of the organ and its music. She has traveled throughout the US and the world promoting and sharing organ music through her innovative concerts. As a professional organist she enjoys a varied career. Besides concertizing and recording, Jeannine has served in a variety of positions in church music ministry and is currently the Minister of Music at St. Bede Episcopal Church in Forest Grove, Oregon, and has a large and active organ studio, and , has held university teaching positions. She is also the President and founder of *Pro-Motion Music* — a company celebrating the world of the organ. Dr. Jordan was awarded the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Organ Performance and Music History from the University of Oregon.

David Jordan, a skilled pianist with a Master of Music degree in composition from Ball State University, is also a media artist. Whether creating the visual portions the Jordan's organ and media events or reimagining photographs, his work inspires and mesmerizes its viewers.

The Jordans are also the creators and performers of the organ and multi-media events *Bach and Sons*, celebrating the life and times of Johann Sebastian Bach and his family, and *From Sea to Shining Sea* featuring the organ music and history of early America.
